Student needs: 40 hours = approx. 10 hours a semester

- No more than 16 credits of 6000/7000-level coursework allowed = approx. 5 6000-7000 classes
- The remaining 24 credits must be 8000-level. Note, though, that all of the required courses, 17 credits worth, are 8000-level, so that leaves approximately 3 courses of elective 8000-level classes
