We are located in Starkville, MS, which is one of the three cities making up the Golden Triangle region (population 128,000). The Golden Triangle Regional airport is nearby, and Starkville is an easy drive from Memphis, New Orleans, Jackson, Birmingham, and the Gulf-coast region.
