Founded in 1776, the Phi Beta Kappa Society is the oldest and most prestigious academic honorary society in the United States. Phi Beta Kappa makes no demands on its members, but membership is the highest possible honor for undergraduates and is an instantly recognizable credential nationwide. Its members included 17 United States Presidents, 42 Supreme Court Justices, and more than 150 Nobel Laureates.

No application is necessary. All potentially qualified students are automatically considered. The Office of the President of Mississippi State University pays lifetime membership fees for all students who are invited to join the Phi Beta Kappa Society.

Requirements as a Psychology Student:

- Meet all requirements for a bachelor's degree in psychology at MSU
- Complete 4 semesters of a foreign language
- Have an overall GPA of at least a 3.8 and at least a 3.8 GPA for Arts and Sciences courses
